A LEVEL EXAM RESULTS – THURSDAY 15th AUGUST 2019

The Post 16 Centre will open for issue of Year 13 results between 8.00am and 10.30am on Thursday 15th August.

UCAS Track will officially start early morning on the 15th August. The exact time has not been specified due to the fear that overwhelming demand will crash the system. It is worth checking Track before you travel to the Centre in case it is operating early. Track will show you whether you have been accepted by your firm or insurance choice but it will not show you your grades.

Prior to the big day, take the chance to prepare yourself for the possible outcomes. As discussed in guidance, your A level grades will lead to one of several possible outcomes. If you need to refresh your understanding of this, there are useful websites such as:

GCSE EXAMINATION RESULTS

These will be available from the Post 16 Centre between **10.00am** and **11.00am** on **Thursday 22nd August 2019**.

If you are on holiday on either of these dates and you would like your exam results posting to you then you should hand in a large stamped, self-addressed envelope at the main office before the end of term (Friday July 19th).

Examination certificates can be collected from Reception in the Post 16 Centre from **Friday November 8th onwards**. If you have not collected your AS level certificates, these will be in your A level results envelope. Please note that we are only required to keep A level certificates for one year, so please ensure you collect them.

ADVICE SESSIONS

When you have your results you may still need help and advice about what to do next. More specifically you may need help with the UCAS 'Clearing' procedures.

Staff will be available in the Post 16 Centre at the following times:
