RE: A LEVEL RESULTS DAY / PROGRESSING FROM YEAR 12 TO 13

I am writing to remind you of some important information and dates:-

Start of A2 courses – Summer 2019

We feel it would be helpful to remind students and parents of some aspects of our policies and procedures as you progress to Year 13. Please note your son/daughter will start the 2nd year of their A Level studies on Monday 3rd June 2019.

Our students are expected to attend all lessons and guidance sessions (from 1st July this will change to session 1, i.e 8.25am) and arrive on time. Should your son / daughter be absent for any reason we would ask you to contact the Centre by 8.15am to inform us.

The course content covered during this time is not repeated in September and therefore students must not take holidays during this time.

Year 12 Examination Results 2019

AS/A2 level exam results will be available from the Post 16 Centre on **Thursday 15th August 2019** between **9.00am and 10.30am** in the Lecture Theatre.

GCSE Examination Results 2019

These will be available from the Post 16 Centre on **Thursday 22nd August 2019** between **10.00am and 11.00am** from main Reception.

If you are on holiday on either of these dates and would like your exam results posting to you please hand in a large stamped self-addressed envelope to the main office by the end of this term (Friday 19th July 2019).

Advice Sessions

When you have your results you may still need help and advice about what to do next. Staff will be available in the Centre on the 15th (Results Day) and 16th August from 9.00am until 1.00pm. Please note that Year 13 students will have priority in terms of staff time on the 16th so be prepared to make an appointment for the next day.

Progressing from Year 12 to Year 13

The principle for entry into Y13 is that students have passed the Year 12 examinations in that subject with an A-E Grade. Most students will continue with 3 subjects in Year 13. There will be some students who will require a 1:1 appointment to discuss their options further. These appointments will be posted home to students after results day and are scheduled to take place on Monday 2nd September and will include students who:-

- are considering continuing with 4 subjects (4 Year 12 passes at high grades, B or above)
- are unsure of which subject to drop
- are in any doubt as to whether their results are sufficient to continue to Year 13
- may wish to discuss an alternative pathway

I have also included a copy of the 'Masterclass' sessions that are being offered to students during the examination season.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish you good luck for your examinations and an enjoyable summer.
